LFCC has recently achieved a significant milestone by providing over 6 million meals, and the demand for our services is on the rise. The need for LFCC's assistance is increasing, with a growing number of individuals, seniors, families (including many with young children), and the homeless seeking our support.





CLIENT SPOTLIGHT TURNING TIDES

Brent once enjoyed a stable life with a good job and a home where he lived with his mother and children. However, a series of challenges, including losing his job, led to the unraveling of his life. Eventually, he found himself homeless with his 9-year-old daughter, living in a tent.

During these difficult times, Brent turned to Loaves and Fishes of Contra Costa in Antioch for support. The

organization became a lifeline, ensuring that he and his daughter didn't have to struggle for their next meal. Loaves and Fishes not only provided them with a daily hot meal but also offered a sense of community. Little did Brent know that these connections would play a pivotal role in giving him purpose later in life.

Reflecting on those challenging times, he considers them a blessing, as they marked the beginning of his journey to overcoming his addictions. Today, he serves as the Program Director at RESTORE, focusing on homeless outreach. Now, Brent delivers 45-50 meals a day, bridging the gap between Loaves and Fishes and homeless encampments.

For Brent, expressing the significance of Loaves and Fishes of Contra Costa in his life is hard to put into words, "Loaves and Fishes offers so much more than a meal".

As we embrace the arrival of the spring, a season synonymous with new opportunities, rejuvenation, and growth, we are delighted to share exciting updates about our meal program. It has undergone significant growth and transformation, directly addressing the evolving needs of our community, all thanks to our dedicated team and the unwavering support of our community.

In the wake of the post-Covid-19 relief programs ending, we faced an unprecedented demand for meals. From our usual 650 meals per day pre-pandemic, we've adapted and expanded, now averaging an impressive 3,000 meals daily.

In 2023, LFCC's meal program underwent a significant transformation. LFCC's Karen Introcaso Mobile Unit

(KI Mobile Unit) now collaborates with Bay Area Community Services (Delta Landing and Opportunity Village) and Bay Area Community Resources (West Pittsburg Community Church) to take meals to where people are.

Drop-off partners include Mt. Diablo Adult Education and Opportunity Junction, while RESTORE (weekdays), Martinez Shelter, and Martinez Senior Center (weekends) serve as pick-up partners.

Stoneman Village – Low-income senior housing. LFCC supplies hot meals on Fridays.

West Pittsburg Community Church via Bay Point All N One - Offers shower, medical, clothing, and other services. LFCC provides 100-350 hot meals per day, Tuesdays to Thursdays. Additionally, we collaborate with partners who receive meal drop-offs and manage the distribution themselves.

S.H.A.R.E – Shower, medical, and clothing program. LFCC provides 50 breakfasts per day on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Opportunity Junction - Career classes. LFCC supplies 35 meals per day from Mondays to Thursdays.

CONCORD

Mt. Diablo Adult Education – LFCC delivers 50 meals per day, Mondays to Thursdays.
